Linda Gregory had a question reference the street lights. In 2008 or 2009, the city received a department of energy grant to replace lights with LED's are these updates of the same project. Donnie Wright or Adam Leach were employed by the City of Muncie for 2008 or 2009 could not answer Linda's question. (FYI Linda Hayes was working at the street department and remembers that the grant Linda referenced too was for the purchase of LED Bulbs (Red-Green-Yellow) for the Traffic Signals within the City of Muncie's corporate limits). Donnie Wright came forward and informed the Board members that Indiana & Michigan Electric recently removed all their high-pressure sodium streetlights with LED Bulbs. My signal techs have been updating our city owned streetlights with LED bulbs. President Gregory entertained a motion.
